- All players must remove watches, earrings, and any other jewelry that the officials deem hazardous. Earrings may not be worn, even if covered with band-aid or tape. No hair bows or clips. Only hair rubber bands or cloth headbands are allowed. No metal.

Section 2. Medical Devices and Conditions

- All medical devices (casts, supports, braces, etc.) are subject to approval of Referee with respect to player safety.
- Players with medical devices should have them padded in advance of the game and check in with the Head Referee or at the Coaches Table prior to the match for approval.
- Any “special circumstance” player must be made known to all Referees and Head Coaches before the start of every game. Parents are responsible to make any known health condition to their Head Coach as it may affect player’s abilities on and off the field. This is for the safety of every player.

Section 3. Player Placement & Participation

- Each team is allowed one coach and one assistant coach.
- Only players registered with the Spring Hill Hawks Youth Sports Organization will be allowed to participate. Players must wear the provided Spring Hill Hawks uniform.
- Coaches should make every effort to ensure that all players have equal field time.
- The league is coeducational athletics, where teams are formed using both sexes, jointly and evenly. Each team is required to have a minimum of at least one female athlete on the field at any time during game

play. *If no female player is available from the roster an exception may be made if both Coaches and all Referees agree.

Section 4. Coaching

- All persons Coaching Spring Hill Hawk’s Soccer (SHHS) players must be registered with the league and TN State Soccer Association (TSSA.)
- All Head and Assistant Coaches must complete and submit TSSA SafeSport, Intro to Grassroots Coaching, Concussion form, and Cardiac form prior to the first game of the season.
- All Head and Assistant Coaches must submit for a background check prior to the first game of the season.
- Only registered/approved Coaches may Coach/Referee games or participate with players during team activities practice.

Section 5. Fields of Play

The SHHS is responsible for providing proper field markings, equipment, and grounds.

Section 6. Play of Game – Conforms to FIFA Laws of the Game, exceptions noted

- Home team is responsible for providing Head Referee a proper size ball that is inflated correctly. Referee discretion on game ball choice. A “backup” game ball should also be Referee inspected and ready for immediate game use.
- Home Team has kick-off at the beginning of the game. Away team has kick-off at the beginning of the second half.
- Opponent must be ten yards from the center mark while kick-off is in progress.
- A goal may NOT be scored directly from the kick-off. A goal can be scored by a Goalkeeper restart with a kick or punt only in division U8 and up.
- **Ball In and Out of Play**
 - The ball is out of play when it has wholly passed over the goal line or touchline on the ground or in the air.

- Play has been stopped by the referee.
- The ball is in play at all other times.
- **Fouls and Misconduct**
 - All fouls and misconduct will result in a direct kick with the opponent ten yards away.
 - All infractions must be explained to the offending player(s).
 - Slide Tackles are not permitted. Any player engaging in slide tackles should be counseled one time not to repeat. Repeated infractions will result in the player be cautioned with yellow card and or sent off with a red card.
 - No “heading” for any age. If the child purposefully heads the ball it will result in an indirect free kick to the other team. The Head Coach or Referee will explain the infraction. If a player continues to repeat offense, they will receive a yellow card, further offenses will result in a red card.
- **Free Kicks, Direct and Indirect**
 - Free kick– the opponents must be ten yards away before kick is allowed.
 - Penalty kick- FIFA Laws apply, and penalty mark will be 10 yards from the goal.
 - Corner kick- FIFA Laws apply, but opponents must be ten yards from the ball.
 - Goal kick- FIFA Laws apply, but goal kick is taken anywhere within the goal area. Opponents must be outside of the penalty box where a penalty box is marked or at least 10 yards away from kicker where it is not. No drop kicks, punts or bounce kicks allowed.
- **Corner Kicks**
 - A corner kick is awarded when the whole ball, having last been touched by the defending team, passes over the goal line and a goal is not scored
 - The ball is placed next to the nearest corner flag without removing the flag, and is kicked by a player on the attacking team
 - Opponents must remain ten yards away from the ball until it is in play
 - A ball is in play once it is kicked or moved, and the player taking the corner kick may not touch the ball a second time until another player touches the ball
- **Player Throw In**
 - U4 divisions should be instructed to “dribble in” or “pass in” by their Referee / Head Coaches. U6 and up age divisions are a regular “Throw In.”

- Referee will advise other age divisions by blow of whistle when player may perform throw in. This rule should only be if the Referee has stopped play by blow of whistle or if there is a substitution occurring at the time of the throw-in, which is also on a whistle stoppage. Typically, if the ball goes out of bounds, the team awarded the throw-in can pick it up and throw it in right away. This movement keeps the tempo of the game going. The Referee will blow the whistle and indicate that they need to hold the ball due to the substitution and the hand signal and blown whistle again will tell players they can proceed with the throw-in.
- Any other age division, the player selected to throw must keep both feet on the ground while the ball is being thrown into play. Further, both feet must be on or behind the line as the ball is being thrown.
- The ball must be thrown by player, with two hands, from over his or her head releasing the ball from their hands while hands are behind or directly above their head.
- If there is a foul throw in, the referee must explain the proper method to the player and the opposing team shall be awarded the throw in at the same spot on the field.

Section 7. Scores & Standings

- The league playoffs and score keeping pertain to U6 and up only.
- All scores are to be recorded, U6 and up divisions only, on the game form by the Referee or team designated score keeper and verified by each Head Coach at the conclusion of the match.
- If a result or score is to be protested, the Head Coach that is protesting, should note such on the game form and file a protest in writing to the Soccer Director within 24 hours.
- The Referee or designated score keeper will turn in the completed forms to the Appropriate SHHS Representative at the Coaches' Table at the conclusion of the match.
- Scores and standings are used to assist in seeding teams for the playoffs.
 - "The Mercy Rule" – there will be a 10-goal mercy rule if the losing Coach requests it be used. The Mercy Rule cannot be applied until the first half has ended and the game is in halftime. The losing Coach must notify the Referee at halftime if invoking it.

Section 8. Sportsmanship, Spectator Expectations, Code of Conduct

- No Spectator is allowed on the field of play at any time during the game. Referee will stop all game play. Spectator will be cautioned and maybe removed from the field.
- Any spectator is encouraged to cheer for players in a respectful and decent manner. No foul language or lewd remarks will be tolerated on the property. Referees, Coaches, and SHHS Administrators have the right at any time to remove any person or party for violating these rules and conducting themselves in a manner deemed inappropriate around our community's children.
- Coaches are required to remain within their respective technical areas unless invited onto the field of play by the Referee.

- Only official team Coaches and Designated Score Keepers as listed on the game form may be in the technical areas and provide instruction to players. This does not apply to U4 and below age divisions.
- Providing “Coaching” instructions from outside of the technical area is not permitted. No Goal Tender Coaching.
- Spectators shall be seated on the opposite side of the field from the teams in U6 and above age divisions.
- Spectators must remain behind the painted standoff line. Typically, a blue line marking spectator area outside the field of play.
- No one, no coaches, parents, other players, etc. will be allowed behind the goal area while games are in play. This includes the entire width of the playing field.
- No Referee Abuse will be tolerated. Person(s) will be immediately removed from playing field area. Coaches, players, and spectators maybe cautioned or removed by the Referee for violation of Code of Conduct and or Referee Abuse.
- Game Officials and Spring Hill Hawks Administration have all authority to prematurely end a game if it is warranted due to violations.
 - **Grounds Clean-Up is expected by each team and all its’ spectators.** Trash receptacles are provided throughout the park. Infractions will be noted, and “clean up duty” for the entire park will be assigned to teams on a rotation basis to ensure the grounds are properly maintained after games if we cannot keep grounds clean.

- Example of Game Day Field Spectator Layout: Team A is Home; Team B is Away. Home team (team A) is closest to the field house and parking lot side of fields. Team B is located on the tree side of the fields.

- Coaches are to remain in their team technical area. Coaches are not allowed to cross the mid field line and enter another team’s technical area. Such violation may draw Referee yellow or red sanction.
