### We Are Now Accepting TOPSoccer Applications

The club has been involved with US Youth Soccer TOPSoccer (The Outreach Program for Soccer), a training and team placement program for young athletes with disabilities for the past decade. The program is designed to provide the opportunity to learn and play soccer for any child ages 4-19, who has a mental or physical disability.

TOPSoccer and Space Coast United's goal is to enable young athletes with disabilities to become valued and successful members of the greater soccer community. The program is completely free and volunteer run.

The program provides great benefits to everyone involved: the players with disabilities, the care-givers, the volunteer trainers, and the SCUSC 'buddies' that learn life-long lessons supporting these handicapped youths.

Player and Buddy applications can be found on-line on the <u>TOPSoccer page</u> of the club website. The ideal buddy is someone who can commit to working with the same player every week and demonstrates patience working with others. The club prefers buddies 14 years of age and older. Applications are due Oct 20, notification of acceptance is by Oct 26, and an orientation followed by the first session is on Nov 2.

### Youth Development Program Extends to U12 in Fall 2013

The club is very excited to have extended our Youth Development Program to the U12 recreational age bracket beginning this fall. According to YDP Director, Rob Dinnie, "With the Academy program extending to U12, it just made sense to mirror this in the recreational bracket as this is still very much a developmental age group."

The extension means the U12 teams will get consistent training on a weekly basis from a club trainer working from the same professional curriculum being used by the U9-11 Academy group. When same age bracket teams practice from the same curriculum at the same time it allows for more practice scrimmage opportunities. The club has also scheduled U12 teams to practice at the same times allowing us to manage the training groups and ensure trainer availability.

The program includes five U12 teams of twelve or so players playing 8 v 8 games throughout Brevard County. The YDP program this fall includes a total of 463 U6-U12 players and an additional 108 U9-U11 Academy players.

"The most pressure they feel is the pressure they put on themselves, we don't keep score...but they sure do!"

Dusty is a psychiatric nurse who believes his time on the Children's Crisis Unit has prepared him well to work with children of all ages and abilities. His nursing experience has come in handy with skinned knees and sprained ankles too!

# Nicole Davanzo: U16/18 Rec Team Manager

The Davanzo family has been with Space Coast United about six months having moved to the area in July 2012. They love the club and have found everyone to be very friendly, organized, and the facilities beautiful.

Nicole has two boys; Patrick, a 15 year old who wants to play soccer all the time and John, a 14 year old who prefers to play during the cooler months. Nicole volunteered as the team manager partly because the coach asked for the help and because she has been a team parent since her kids played in their pre-K years. "I think I was having withdrawal symptoms...I love being involved in my kids' sports even though I am not athletic at all."

According to Nicole, the recreation league is wonderful because it works well with the kids' school schedules and other activities. It gives them a chance to still be active in a not so intense setting. She says that, "Even though we have only been with the recreation program two seasons, I see the kids grow together and maybe make friends that they would not have at school. I know from a parent stand point, I like the fact that the kids are still playing a sport but it's not always about winning, it's about letting everyone play to the best of their abilities."

He thinks he was around 6 years old when he began playing soccer in Melbourne. At his first ever Comp game, they asked for a volunteer to play in goal. He stepped forward and the rest is history. At the age of 14 he switched to a club that is now part of Orlando City Youth Soccer and played for them until he graduated high school. He was a member of the Florida '87 ODP team and played for Melbourne Central Catholic HS; winning State and National championships in 2003 and state runner up in '04 and '05. Cory was the starting goal keeper for Florida Institute of Technology for four years.

He began coaching his sophomore year of college starting at MEGU and moving to Space Coast United last year. Cory has coached with Dean Flexton at Holy Trinity as well. He has a USSF C License and a Level

3 Goalkeeping License.

About his players, Coach Collins says, "I want them to develop and improve their skills and knowledge of the game in a competitive environment, promoting success. Most of all though, I want them to enjoy their time on the field and feel that every time they leave a session or a game they have learned something new."
