Coaches, Players and Parents COVID 19 Protocols

- Players must sign in before every practice and games.
- Hand sanitizer must be used before, during and after practices and games
- Masks must be worn in the dugout or when a person can't social distance. (coaches meeting w/ players or player to player) during practices and games
- Mask are not required to be worn on the field during games
- Players must try to have social distance (6ft apart) between each other on the fields during practices and games.
- Do not share equipment if at all possible please. (water bottles, helmets, gloves, batting gloves etc....)
- No spitting. (No seeds or gum in dugout)
- Cover mouths when sneezing, coughing.
- Parents please **do not** bring your child, if they don't feel well or have been under the weather.
- If you have been sick or tested for covid19 coaches please inform League president Chris Gutierrez or Safety officer Hector Carpio directly ASAP.
- If your family/ player has been exposed at any time coaches please inform the League president or safety officer directly. ASAP
- Please don't put any of your personal details or HIPPA information on a group chat. Let respect each other privacy
- If at any time there is COVID 19 confirmation or concern the team will require a 14-day shut down.

- The player/players will not return to fields for practice or games until 10 days after a positive test. Players must have 72 hours of no symptoms as per the Pima County Health Department.
- Parents as spectators please practice social distance with non-family household members. Please use masks when approaching other individuals.
- No more than 10 people under a pop tent or spectator area
- Parents and spectators please do not approach the dugout for other than your own player issues/ injuries. Masks must be worn while doing so. Please wait for coaches to wave you onto the field or into the dugout.
- If a child is injured please have him/her treated outside of the dugout if possible. Masks must be worn at all times.
- Spectators must wear masks and social distance.
