
Coach Cody Doremus – Coaching Instructor Boys Tomahawk Lacrosse:

During her four-years as a starter, she notched team, regional and national records, was named 1st Team All-Conference, All-American and selected as the Coca-Cola MVP in 2002. Kristin (a former soccer-head) found her love of lacrosse as a sophomore in high school, when the lacrosse coach recruited her, after a soccer game. Mt. Hebron High School women's lacrosse was a dynasty in the sport; having won county and state championships continuously from 1992 – 2007 (also earning 7 national titles). Kristin earned First Team All-County honors and was selected to play in the All-Star game. Lacrosse Magazine name Mt. Hebron High School Women's Lacrosse, "Best in the Nation," in 1999. Much of the high school's success was due to the strong youth, feeder programs. Kristin has spent several years on the sidelines as a coach; most notably, taking the Granite Bay High School Women's Lacrosse team (Granite Bay, CA) team from 1 and 14, to 14 and 1 in just 1 year.
