Helpful Hints:

- If you cannot get this information, try to get the license plate, make & model of the car or if you have an e-mail address.
- Ask others around the area if they know the person if you cannot obtain any information.
- Best way to avoid incident is to be aware of your pet's warning signs.
- If a "dog fight" occurs sources suggest that owners try to make loud noise, like use a dog-whistle, yell, clap hands to distract pet, throw a ball or distract with a toy etc.
- As an owner you NEED to have your leash close by you to remove your dog from a situation.
- Please be aware if your dog is on the wrong side of the park, large or small side, which is based from weight restrictions, this can be part of the problem. 50 lbs. or more should be in the large dog side, under 50 lbs. should be in attending the small dog park side.
- If you have to physically step-in to break-up the dogs, it is recommended to grab your pet from the hind legs and lift your pet hind legs off the ground. This way the owner stays safe and less likely to be bitten.
