Welcome back for the Fall 2023 season. Our Fall season is focused on player development over competition. This is a great season for players to try new levels, play different positions, and of course – make new friends. It's also a great opportunity for parents to try managing or assistant coaching teams, as the workload is lighter than in the Spring season. We will again be playing with our neighboring leagues which will give players a chance to visit other fields.

This guide and our website will help you to complete registration. If you created an account for 2023 All-Stars, Fun Tournament, 2022 Fall Ball, or 2023 Spring, you do not need to create an account. If you are new to the League or did not participate in one of the activities named above, you will need to create an account. **Please create one account per family.** Please look over the guide and website before you begin so you can gather any needed documentation in advance to speed up registration.

WSLL Fall 2023 Registration FAQ

- **What are the key dates for the WSLI fall season**
 - Registration: June 5, 2023, to August 4, 2023
 - Teams announced the second week of August
 - Practices start – 3rd week of August.
 - Season begins on Saturday September 9th.
 - Season ends on Saturday between October 28th and November 4
- **How is the Fall season different from Spring?**
 - Our Fall season is a developmental season. The focus is on developing skills and trying new things in a less competitive environment than how we play in the Spring Season.
 - We do not keep standings, and there are no playoffs.
 - At the higher playing levels, WSLI teams play against teams from other neighboring leagues.

WSLL Fall 2023 Registration FAQ

- **What level should my child play at in the Fall?**

- Players may stay at their Spring 2023 playing level or play up one level if they are ready to try it. For example, if your player did well in Spring 2023, they may consider moving up a playing level for Fall 2023. Nevertheless, if during the spring season the player found it challenging to keep up with the level of competition or had several aspects of their game that needed additional time to develop, then they should stay at the same level for Fall 2023. Trying to automatically move up playing levels in Fall season may be detrimental to the player's development and enjoyment of the game. Your spring coaches should be able to advise you in these decisions.
- We do not offer the 5T playing level in fall, so all players from the spring 5T level must register to the T-ball level in the fall.
- Players that received an age waiver to play up in spring must remain at the same level as they did in spring 2023, no exceptions.
- Please note that playing up in fall does not guarantee that the player will play at that level in spring 2024. Also, staying at the same level of play as spring 2023 does not prevent the player from registering for the next level in Spring 2024 (as long as age requirements are met).
- If your player is new to WSLL please look carefully at the age chart and skills required for each level as detailed in slides 9, 10 & 11

WSLL Fall 2023 Registration FAQ

- **How can parents volunteer to manage or coach a team?**
 - Online Registration – Parents can register to manager or coach a team at the same time they register players. Registering to manage is highly encouraged in order to keep roster sizes manageable.
- **Can I request a specific teammate/coach for my child?**
 - Requests can be made for players at all levels using the Special Request/Comments field during online registration.
 - Please note that we do everything possible to satisfy these requests but we cannot guarantee that all requests will be fulfilled.
- **Will players be provided custom-sized uniforms?**
 - Yes, players at all levels will select their jersey size during online registration.
- **Do you automatically assign players to the same team as last spring?**
 - Fall teams are not built based on spring teams, and there are no fall try-outs.
 - All players may request to play with specific coaches, teammates or players from a specific neighborhood/school.
 - While we try to honor all player and coaches requests, we cannot guarantee requests.
 - A parent volunteering to manage increases the chances of securing teammates requested.
 - After addressing teammate/coach request we use player school affiliation or neighborhood.

Fall 2023 Registration Rates – Early Registration

- ***\$25 discount for second child and beyond in same family**
- **Rates increase by \$25 per player on 7/17/2022**
- Registration rates includes cost of player jersey and hat and shared team equipment (e.g., bats, helmets, catcher's equipment, etc.)
- Players are responsible for providing their own baseball glove, cleats, protective cup, pants, etc.

WSLL Refund Policy

Upon written request submitted to the President or Treasurer received before July 15th, the League will refund 100% of amounts paid. Upon written request submitted to the President or Treasurer before August 1st, the League will refund 50% of the registration fee and 100% of any volunteer fee paid. A \$10 handling charge for all refunds will be assessed. A \$15 returned check fee will be charged for all returned checks (not sufficient funds/closed account.)

Scholarships Available

Why do you charge a Volunteer Fee

Why does WSLL charge a volunteer fee?

- To successfully run a baseball season requires hundreds of hours of volunteer effort above what can be performed by the WSLL BOD
- Accordingly, WSLL charges a refundable volunteer fee to each family (excluding families with players only registered at the T-ball levels) in order to incentivize families to perform that work or to use the funds to contract out such work
- The volunteer fee also helps WSLL avoid time consuming fund-raising endeavors that can be frustrating for both players and parents.

How can families pay the volunteer fee, and how is it refunded if volunteer work is performed?

- Online Registration: If paying by credit card, the \$100 volunteer fee must be pre-paid when registering online. The full fee will be refunded later if your volunteer work requirements are met.

How can parents earn back their volunteer fee?

- Working one (1) four-hour shift on any of the dates during any of the preseason field preparation dates.
- Working two (2) 3-hour shifts in the Snack Bar/Concession Stand,, two (2) league equipment pick up/turn-in sessions, or any combination of two (2) shifts of these activities.
- Serving as a League photographer and submitting photos that meet the requirements specified by the WSLL Yearbook chairperson.
- Serving as a Team Manager at the 1A level or above, plus two (2) assist the Gray Hat sessions with designated WSLL Board Members.

Online Registration

- All players (new and returning) should register online
- Registration Dates:
 - Early Registration: 6/5/2023 – 7/16/23
 - Registration: 7/17/23 - 8/4/23

2. Go to www.wsllbaseball.net and click on the link for Registration Info and select Fall 2023 Registration Info

3. Log in to your Sports Connect account

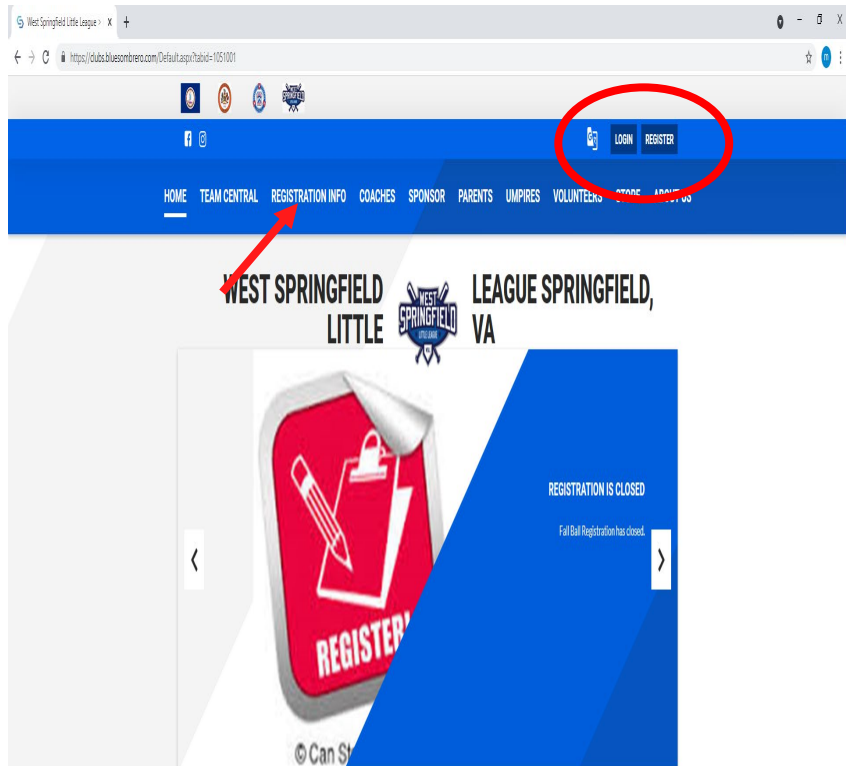
- Log in with your email and password
- Click 'Reset Password' if you forgot your password
- Click 'Create an Account' only if your family is new to WSL and does not already have an account

4. Click on Account Settings to update player/family information

- Add/update Emergency Contact info (required)
- Click on child's name to add/update child's Medical Info (required) and other information (e.g., home address, player's school, current grade, etc.)
- Click on Add Adult to add other parents/relatives to your account

4. Complete Registrations

- Follow the online registration process for players and adult volunteers (e.g., managers/coaches/team parents)
- Complete payment process as instructed

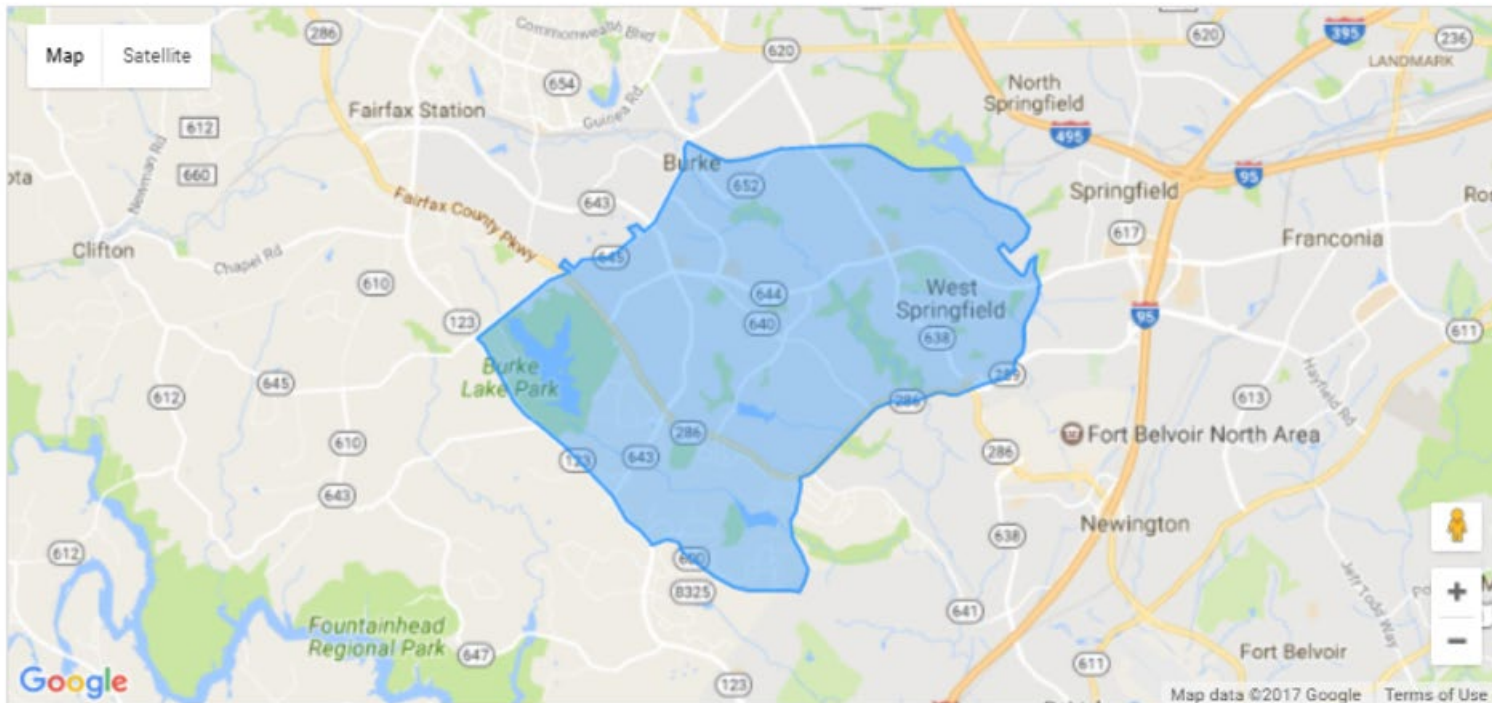

Online Registration - WSSL Boundary Map

- If your child played in our 2023 spring season, their eligibility has been verified and no additional documentation is needed.
- To verify WSSL eligibility - enter home or school address at <http://www.littleleague.org/LeagueFinder.htm>
- Your registration will be 'flagged' if the system does not recognize your address to be within the WSSL residential boundaries. You will be allowed to complete registration, but may be asked for additional documents to prove eligibility to play in WSSL (e.g., proof of school enrollment within WSSL boundaries).

WSLL Playing Level Age Guidelines

- The table below may be helpful in assisting you in registering your player
- League Age for the 2023 Fall Season will be based on a player's age as of 8/31/21

Permitted only in special circumstances (e.g., first time player, developmental limitations, etc.).

WSLL Playing Level Descriptions (5T-Majors)

1) 5-T

- Introduction to baseball concepts and skills for 5 year olds.
- Teams meet weekly on Saturdays for 90 minutes. The weekly meetings will consist of two parts, a practice session and a game.

2) T-Ball

- For young players who require some training in basic baseball concepts and skills

3) 1A (Machine Pitch)

- Player can catch most balls thrown to them overhand from 40'.
- Throw accurately to a 40' target.
- Hit the ball regularly in T-Ball, and at least occasionally, out of the infield.
- Catch fly balls with glove fingers facing up.

4) AA (Player Pitch)

- Catch 75% of the balls thrown to them overhand from 50'.
- Throw accurately to a 50' target
- Hit the ball regularly at the 1A level, and at least occasionally out of the infield.
- Catch fly balls routinely with glove fingers facing up and throw with good form.

5) AAA (Player Pitch)

- Catch, with ease, almost every ball thrown from 60 feet.
- Throw a ball with good mechanics accurately to a receiver 60' away.
- Hit the ball regularly with some authority, and, at least occasionally, out of the infield at the AA level.
- Routinely catch fly balls in a proper fielding position.

6) Majors (Player Pitch)

- Meet all of the qualifications of AAA players (as described below).
- Have had some success in AAA; or, if they never played in AAA, demonstrate through tryouts or their play at other levels or leagues that they could have.

5) IM (Player Pitch)

- League Age 12 Players

Conditions of Registration

- **Behavior.** I understand that failure by either a parent or player to abide by Little League, WSLI, or team rules is grounds for suspension, and *removal of the player* from the league. Grounds for such actions include: persistent, unexcused absences from practices; verbal and physical abuse of parents, coaches, managers, umpires or league officials; misuse of league grounds and equipment; violations of public law; and any other behavior that undermines the league's effort to conduct itself according to the rules of Little League Baseball.
- **Disputes.** I understand that the team must try to satisfy up to 12 different families, within the restraints imposed by the Rules of Little League Baseball and WSLI. Thus, if I cannot volunteer to be a manager or coach, I will do my best to support the manager. If I have a serious disagreement with the manager, I will seek an appointment with him or her away from a game setting to discuss my concern. I understand that, if the dispute cannot be resolved, I may contact the League Director, who is my manager's supervisor. League Director email addresses can be accessed through the web site. I also may contact the Vice President for Baseball Operations, who supervises the League Directors, or the President any time I have a concern or question that cannot be resolved at the team level.
- **Umpires.** I understand that if I do not volunteer to umpire, and if no one on my team volunteers to umpire, there may be no umpires for my child's games. WSLI has multiple training opportunities for new and returning umpires. The league does not assign umpires to 5T, T-Ball, and 1A games. While WSLI endeavors to attract and assign at least one umpire to AA, AAA, and Majors games, our experience indicates that on average volunteers will cover only 75% of the games (less at lower levels, more at higher levels).
- **Rainouts.** Unless otherwise notified by their manager or the league, players must come to the game field. On weekdays, the league attempts to make a decision regarding the status of scheduled games by 3pm, then will communicate that information via email or website posting. On weekends, when the weather is so bad that there clearly will be wholesale cancellations, WSLI endeavors to communicate cancellations as soon as they are known.
