Viera Girls U12 Rec Team Take 3v3 by Storm

Team Crazy Socks, made up of girls in our U12 Rec program, went undefeated at the 2nd Annual Rachel Price Memorial 3v3 Challenge on January 24th. They outscored their opponents 38-6! The team also won the Space Coast 3v3 Tournament in December, beating teams in the playoffs 13-3 who had outscored them 7-4 in pool play.

Amazingly, Team Crazy Socks did not win a game last year. But according to Coach Michaud, "through a lot practice during the soccer season and afterwards on their own as a team, they improved their skills to help win this tournament. This was a very balanced team where everyone scored and helped contribute on defense throughout each game."

The girls were down 0-2 early in the championship game before coming back and scoring 8 goals to win the championship 8-2 over a team from Orlando.

The team is looking forward to playing in the Challenge Sports National tournament at Disney's Wide World of Sports in the late summer and after this tournament they will be ranked 2nd in their division.

They fought their way back to a 2-2 draw taking the game to extra time. No score in extra time resulted in a tense penalty kick shoot out to decide the championship.

The Space Coast keeper managed to get a glove on the Predator's third shot, denying a goal. All five Space Coast shooters found the back of the net with a sense of calm and finesse that would make Ronaldo jealous.


