

Space Coast United Soccer Club Tournament Field Marshal Responsibilities

Check-In

- Report to the Site Desk and identify yourself as a Field Marshal volunteer.
- Pick up your vest and walkie-talkie
 - The number of Field Marshals may be greater than the number of walkie-talkies available at peak times.
 - You may exchange cell phone numbers with a tournament official in lieu of using a walkie-talkie.
- Ensure understanding of assignment: Field locations and Duration
- Familiarize yourself with field numbers, the location of first aid supplies, medical personnel, restroom facilities, concessions, and tournament staff.

General Responsibilities

- <u>Visibility</u>: Wear your Field Marshal vest at all times. Your visible presence makes a big difference.
- <u>Field Safety</u>: Walk your assigned area of the park and check for debris. If you spot a safety concern that you are unable to resolve on your own, notify a tournament official.
- <u>Dogs</u>: If you see unleashed dogs, kindly remind owners that this is strictly forbidden. The liability is too great if a child gets hurt.
- <u>Injuries</u>: Direct injured players to first aid or summon assistance by contacting a tournament official in the event a player must be attended to at the field.

Game Responsibilities

- <u>Introduction</u>: If at all possible, introduce yourself to referees and coaches before the games so they know to contact you if there are any problems.
- <u>Maintain Distance</u>: Keep spectators a safe distance behind the touchlines.
- <u>Behavior</u>: Help keep unruly coaches, parents and spectators calm. Often your visible presence is enough. If a problem persists after a polite reminder that the club adheres to a positive Code of Conduct, report the incident to a tournament official.

Check-Out

- Report to the Site Desk to notify tournament staff of your departure.
- Return your vest and walkie-talkie
- Report any issues to the tournament staff that may require follow up or monitoring by your replacement.
