Little League Pitching Regulations Quick Reference Guide

Baseball Pitch Limits (based on League Age not Division:

League Age 13-16; 95 pitches per day

League Age 11-12; 85 pitches per day

League Age 9-10; 75 pitches per day

League Age 7-8; 50 pitches per day

Rest Requirements:

Pitchers league age 14 and under must adhere to the following rest

requirements: • 66 or more pitches in a day, four (4) calendar days of rest must be

observed. • 51 - 65 pitches in a day, three (3) calendar days of rest must be

observed. • 36 - 50 pitches in a day, two (2) calendar days of rest must be

observed. • 21 - 35 pitches in a day, one (1) calendar days of rest must be

observed. • 1-20 pitches in a day, no (0) calendar day of rest is required.

*NOTE: Under no circumstance shall a player pitch in three (3) consecutive

days. Pitchers league age 15-16 must adhere to the following rest

requirements: • 76 or more pitches in a day, four (4) calendar days of rest must

be observed. • 61 - 75 pitches in a day, three (3) calendar days of rest must be

observed. • 46 - 60 pitches in a day, two (2) calendar days of rest must be

observed. • 31 - 45 pitches in a day, one (1) calendar days of rest must be

observed. • 1-30 pitches in a day, no (0) calendar day of rest is required.

*NOTE: Under no circumstance shall a player pitch in three (3) consecutive days.

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<u>Threshold Definition:</u> the minimum number of pitches regarding number of days rest. If a pitcher reaches a day(s) of rest threshold while facing a batter, the pitcher may continue to pitch until anyone of the following conditions occur:

- 1. That batter reaches base.
- 2. That batter is retired.
- 3. The third out is made to complete the half-inning.

The pitcher will only be required to observe the calendar day(s) of rest for the threshold he/she reached during that at at-bat, provided that pitcher is removed before delivering a pitcher to another batter.

Baseball Pitcher/Catcher Relationship:

- 1. A pitcher who delivers 41 or more pitches in a game cannot play the position of catcher for the remainder of that day. (Subject to threshold)
- 2. Any player, who has played the position of catcher in four (4) or more innings in a game, is not eligible to pitch on that calendar day. **Note:** The catcher receiving one pitch to a batter in the fourth inning constitutes having caught four (4) innings. Warm-up pitches do not count.
- 3. A player who played the position of catcher for three (3) innings or less, moves to the pitcher position, and delivers 21 pitches or more (15- and 16-year-olds: 31 pitches or more) in the same day, may not return to the catcher position on that calendar day. (Subject to threshold)

A pitcher once removed from the mound cannot return as a pitcher in Majors Division and below. A pitcher remaining in the game in Intermediate and above, may return one time subject to eligibility.
