PMWYWA 2025-2026 Work Bond Agreement

PMWYWA uses a work bond system as a practical way to encourage parent or family involvement, ensuring that volunteer roles get filled, and keep the program affordable for all families. PMWYWA operates on a 10-point workbond system. Below are the expectations for the 2025-2026 work bond:

- Each volunteer hour equals one work bond point (see examples below).
- Work bond points for food donations are determined by the cost and preparation time involved (see examples below).
- Families are asked to complete 6 volunteer hours. You can also earn up to 4 points through food donations.
- A sign up link will be posted in advance of each event via [signupgenius.com](https://www.signupgenius.com) and posted to the SportsYou app.
- Parents, guardians, or siblings who wish to volunteer in the concession stand, raffle stand, or any other position involving the handling of money must have their clearances submitted and approved by the school board prior to the event. Information on how to obtain these clearances is available on our website or by contacting an Executive Board member.

Examples on How to Earn Work Bond Points

Food Examples	Volunteer Hours
Large Crock Pot Item - 2 points	Mat Set Up before event - 2 hours, 2 points
Large Tray of Hot Food - 2 points	Mat Break Down after event - 1 hour, 1 point
Tray of Mini Subs - 2 points	Event Table Help - 3 hours, 3 points
Baked Goods (24 cupcakes, 24 brownies, 24 baggies of cookies, etc) - 0.5 point each	Concession Stand Help - 3 hours, 3 points
Prepared Taco Meat (5 pounds) - 2 points	50/50 Table - 3 hours, 3 points
