

History

- CDGS is a non-profit organization offering fast pitch softball to girls ages 4
 through 18 years old. Participants of the league are mainly those girls that
 reside within the boundaries of Central School District#301. CDGS was started
 in 2000 and without the benefit of a park district, the league operates solely
 on a volunteer basis and funding is exclusively received through registration
 fees and the generosity of our corporate and family sponsors. The league was
 fortunate enough to have the home fields donated by the Village of Lily Lake
 in 2000. In 2014 to further improve our league, CDGS made the decision to
 become part of the Little League Organization.
- Also note there is more history before CDGS, Field 1 is named after Jaclyn Knewitz who passed away in a car accident at age 11 Oct 1998. She was a 6th grader at Central Middle School and was a member of the school's softball league. She played first base and catcher.

- All players and parents are required to sign the Coaches Code of Conduct. CDGS strongly enforces these guidelines as well as the ejection policy


Expectations

 - HOLD A PARENTS MEETING BEFORE YOUR FIRST PRACTICE - THIS WILL HELP IMMENSELY!
 - Teach the game the right and safe way.
 - Have written practice plans!
 - Be the bigger person.
 - Make sure everyone is having fun while learning to play.
 - Don't lose your temper in front of the kids!

Code of Conduct



CDGS is committed to providing a supportive, respectful, and enriching experience for all its participants. Coaches play a pivotal role in achieving this mission, serving as models of sportsmanship, leadership, and integrity. This Code of Conduct outlines the expectations for all CDGS coaches to ensure a positive and constructive environment for our young athletes.

Core Principles

- **Professionalism and Respect:** Coaches will conduct themselves professionally and respectfully at all times, setting a positive example for players, parents, and spectators.
- **Sportsmanship:** Coaches will demonstrate sportsmanship, encouraging players to compete with integrity, respect for opponents, and graciousness in both victory and defeat.
- **Player Well-Being:** The physical, emotional, and psychological well-being of players is paramount. Coaches will prioritize safety, enjoyment, and development over winning.
- Adherence to Rules: Coaches will adhere to all league rules, policies, and guidelines, promoting fair play and respect for the game's integrity.
- Reporting and Preventing Abuse: Verbal or physical abuse, obscene gestures, and
 disrespectful conduct based on race, gender, religion, disability, national origin, age, and/or
 sexual orientation will not be tolerated. Commit to the recognition, response, and reporting
 of any signs of abuse or neglect. Ensure a policy of no one-on-one isolation with players by
 maintaining a minimum of two adults present at all times.





Behavioral Guidelines

- **Respect for Officials:** Coaches will respect umpires' decisions, handling any disputes with decorum and through appropriate channels.
- **Positive Environment:** Coaches will foster a positive, encouraging environment, recognizing effort and improvement over mere outcomes.
- **Inclusion and Fairness:** Coaches will ensure equal opportunities for all players to participate and develop, irrespective of skill level, fostering an inclusive team spirit.
- **Communication:** Coaches will communicate constructively with players, parents, and league officials, maintaining transparency and promoting a collaborative community.

Enforcement and Penalties

- **Immediate Action:** Offenders may be removed from the field by an umpire or board member, with conduct reviewed promptly by the CDGS Board.
- **Penalties:** Depending on the severity of the violation, the CDGS Board of Directors may impose suspension from coaching or participation for a defined period or number of games, a ban from all CDGS activities for a set timeframe, or for severe violations, suspension for the remainder of the season, including playoffs and all-star play.

Ejection Policy for Conduct Violations

To emphasize the importance of upholding the highest standards of conduct and sportsmanship, CDGS has established a financial penalty system for coaches ejected from a game due to conduct violations:

- First Ejection: \$100 penalty, payable before further participation.
- **Second Ejection:** \$250 penalty, also payable before resuming any league activities. The enforcement process involves the Board's review and notification to the coach, with a 7-day payment window. Collected penalties support league activities and programs. This policy underscores our commitment to a positive sporting environment.
- Upon notification of ejection, the board will hold a special meeting gathering involved CDGS coaches to gather statements. Board will attempt to get a statement from umpire. If after deliberation, the coach was deemed to violate the CDGS Code of Conduct, discipline will be rendered according to the ejection policy.

- Little League may be notified if needed.

Practice Etiquette



- Practices both before and during the season MUST be added via the CDGS website!
- Practices are required to be held at the specific, approved parks/fields listed on the CDGS website. If you are found to be practicing at a location other than the pre-approved sites, you will be subject to disciplinary action per the Coach's Code of Conduct.
- Please limit your pre-season practices to a maximum of 3 per week to allow enough availability for all teams. Utilize Sundays whenever possible!
- Leave the fields the same way you found them bases/pitching rubbers must be put away in field sheds and locked. You will be responsible for any missing equipment!

5. Once an agreement on a makeup date has been reached, notify Travis Parry & Seth Rindner to confirm schedule updates.6. The updated makeup date will be changed on your schedule

within 24 hours.

Please review ASAP Plan and AED policy.

Face Masks are required for pitchers. Additionally, they are highly recommended for all players.

Injuries need to be reported to the safety officer. Supplemental insurance through AIG/Little league. Forms are linked in the ASAP Plan.

Please check your players equipment and fields prior to practice and games. Ensure there are no hazards. Please report field concerns to Board Member.

Three AED's on site. One on the garage side of the snack shack, one in the field one shed, and an extra if needed for remote fields.

SKYSCAN lightning detector in snack shack. Please use. Either snack shack workers or coaches. Instruction sheet placed with the detector.

First aid kits will be handed out. These need to be at all events. If you need to resupply contact Safety Officer.
